AFFIDAVIT

After being duly sworn the undersigned deposes and states that I am Helena Police Department Detective Richard Drysdale and I am familiar with the investigation relating to Jeremy Steven MacGregor conducted by the Helena Police Department. I believe the facts developed during the investigation support this court finding that probable cause exists to believe the defendant committed the offenses of ATTEMPT (DELIBERATE HOMICIDE) in violation of Sections 45-4-103 and 45-5-102, MCA, on two occasions on or about April 15, 2010, in the County of Lewis and Clark, State of Montana:

The facts establishing probable cause are as follows:

On April 15, 2010, at approximately 2224 hours, a female called 911 from 1107 11th Avenue, Helena, Lewis and Clark County, Montana, to report a loud verbal argument between the husband and wife that lived at the house. The female identified herself as B.M., and said that she was the nanny for the husband and wife's children. Officer Domingo Zapata and other officers from the Helena Police Department responded to the residence where they interviewed the husband, Jeremy Steven MacGregor [MacGregor], his wife, J.M., and the nanny, B.M. and

1 learned from he and his wife that they had a verbal argument, during which he tripped and fell,
2 breaking a wine glass and cutting his hand. He refused the medical attention offered to him by
3 the responding officers who determined that because no physical altercation had occurred
4 between anyone in the house and everyone indicated they were comfortable remaining together
5 at the house, there was no reason to remain at the residence.

6 At approximately 2257 hours, J.M. called 911 to report that she was at the corner of 11th
7 Avenue and North Montana Avenue. She said she had been shot by MacGregor at their
8 residence. She said he was still at their residence with their two daughters and the nanny.

9 Officer Jeff Wilson (Officer Wilson) and other officers responded to the intersection of
10 11th Avenue and North Montana Avenue. As they approached the residence at 1107 11th
11 Avenue they observed MacGregor exiting the front door holding a one-year-old infant and a
12 six-year-old child stood nearby. MacGregor relinquished custody of the infant when requested
13 to do so by the officers and he was taken into custody immediately. Officers entered the house
14 to determine whether other occupants were safe. In the basement they found B.M. laying on
15 the floor with multiple gunshot wounds. She was conscious and stated that MacGregor shot
16 her. Officers observed a silver revolver with a black handle on the floor in the basement.

17 Emergency Medical Service responders transported the women to St. Peter's Hospital
18 for treatment. B.M. received treatment for multiple gunshot wounds; J.M. received treatment
19 for a single gunshot wound. Both women remain hospitalized with life-threatening injuries
20 caused by gunshot wounds.

21 Detective Bryan Dellwo (Detective Dellwo) interviewed J.M. at St. Peter's hospital who
22 said that after officers left the residence she attempted to put her husband to bed. She said that
23 while in the bedroom he pulled a handgun from a leather holster, and tried to put the gun to her
24 head. She said she pushed the gun away and struggled with him before running from the room
25 to the front door area of the house where she turned around out of concern for her children and
